### **Community Garden**

The Community Garden is back for another year. Located near the Montgomery water tower, residents can rent a  $10 \times 10$  plot to garden over the summer. The fee to reserve a plot is \$15 per plot. An additional damage deposit of \$25 per plot will also be collected.

#### **Compost Site**

#### **Emerald Ash Borer Project**

The removal of trees due to Emerald Ash Borer has started in Memorial and Northside Parks. The removal and replacement of these trees has been supported with a grant that the City received from the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources.

Residents have inquired about helping with the reforestation of the park. If you have an interest in assisting with this project, please contact City Hall.

#### WATER SAVING TIP

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) estimates that the average U.S. citizen wastes 2 gallons daily on oral hygiene. That might amount to 600 million gallons wasted daily! Don't run the faucet when you aren't using it. That's a 'nice save' for Minnesota's water future. It's important for each of us to save water, every day. Shutting off the faucet will help with water conservation.

Brushing teeth uses 2 gallons (tap on). Hand washing uses 2 gallons (tap on). Tub bathing uses 40 gallons (full). Showering uses 5 gallons per minute. Toilet flushing uses 5-7 gallons. Shaving uses 3-5 gallons (tap on).

Unused running water is like connecting a drain to your tap; wasting water!
